**CHILD PROTECTION ORDER**  
**under Section 37 of the Children's Hearings (Scotland) Act 2011**

In the application by East Lothian Council, John Muir House, Haddington for a Child Protection Order the Sheriff makes a Child Protection Order in respect of the child Ronnie Martin, male child born 09/02/2014.

The Sheriff orders;

- (a) the removal of the child by the applicant to a place of safety in accordance and the keeping of the child at that place.
- (b) To require any person in a position to do so to produce the child to the applicant.
- (c) Authorise the prevention of the removal of the child from any place where he is being accommodated in terms of paragraph (a).
- (d) Dispense with service on the child or any other person for the following reasons:
  - i. The urgency of the current situation.
  - ii. The age of the child.

**DIRECTIONS**

In terms of section 41 the sheriff gives the following directions to the applicant as to contact with the child -

That contact between the natural mother and the child be once per week to be supervised by the social work department.

No contact between the presumed natural father and the child.

In terms of section 42 the sheriff gives the following directions as to the exercise or fulfilment of parental responsibilities or parental rights in respect of the child -

For the purpose of enforcing this order, warrant is granted to officers of law for all lawful execution, including—

- (a) searching for and apprehending the child;
- (b) taking the child to the authorised place;  
where (i) it is not reasonably practicable to take the child immediately to the authorised place; and (ii) the authorised place is
- (c) not a place of safety, taking the child to and detaining the child in a place of safety for as short a period of time as is practicable;
- (d) so far as necessary, by breaking open shut and lockfast places.
